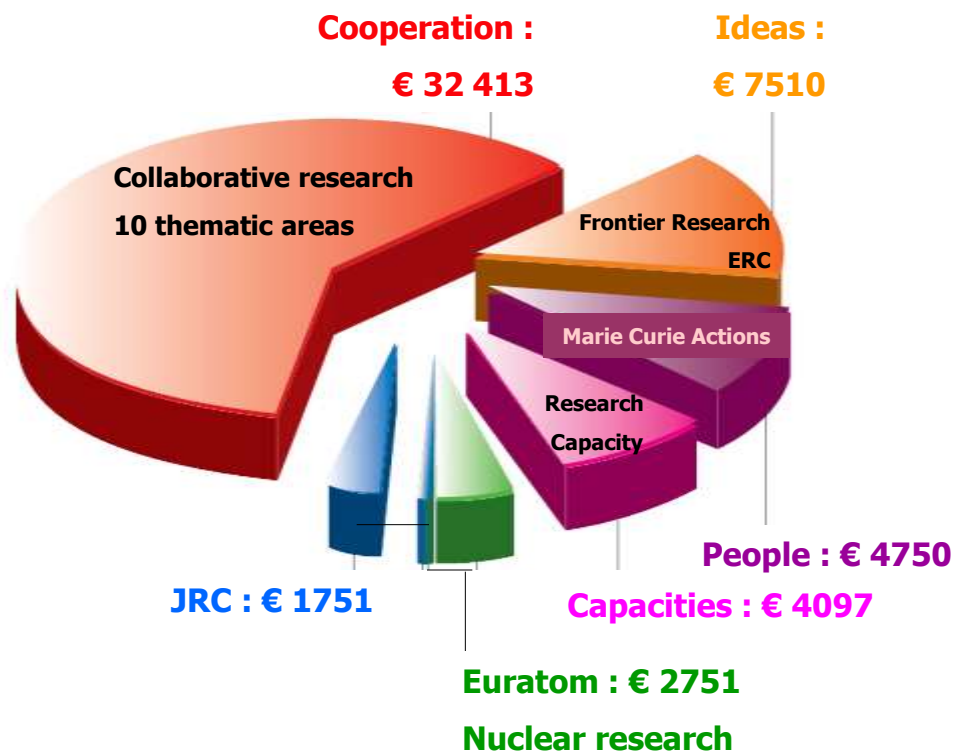
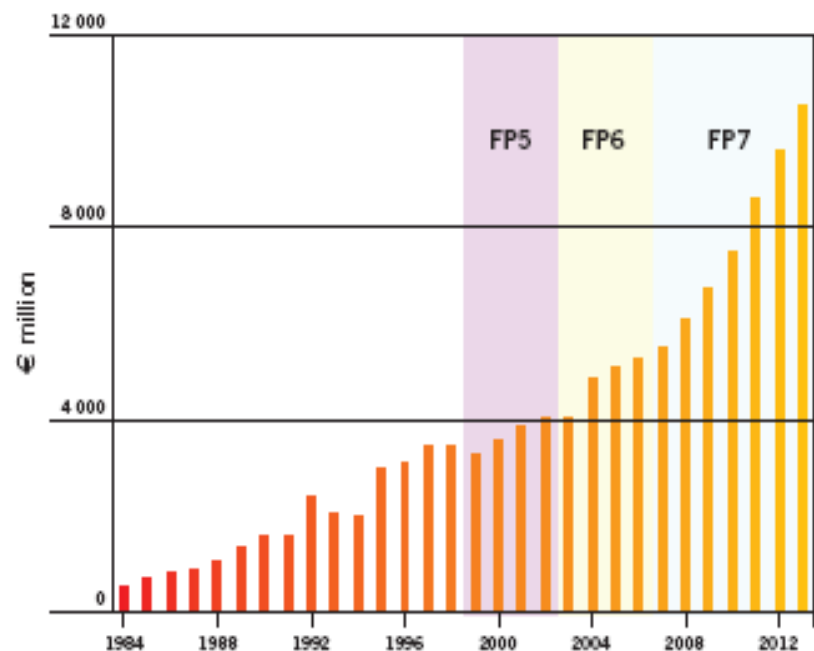


Evolution of annual budget

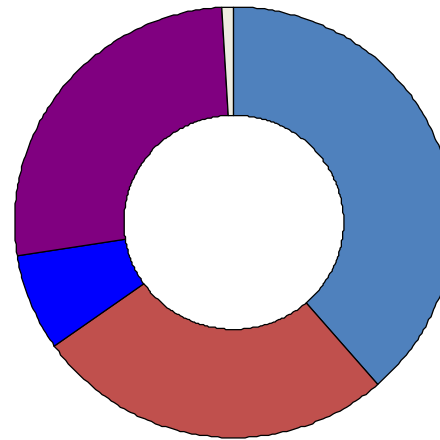

Objectives of the Marie Curie Actions:

Evolved from pure mobility actions to a dedicated programme for structuring training, mobility and career development

- Stimulate people to enter into the profession of researcher
- Encouraging researchers to stay in Europe
- Attracting researchers from around the world
- Enhancing international cooperation and transfer of knowledge between research organisations

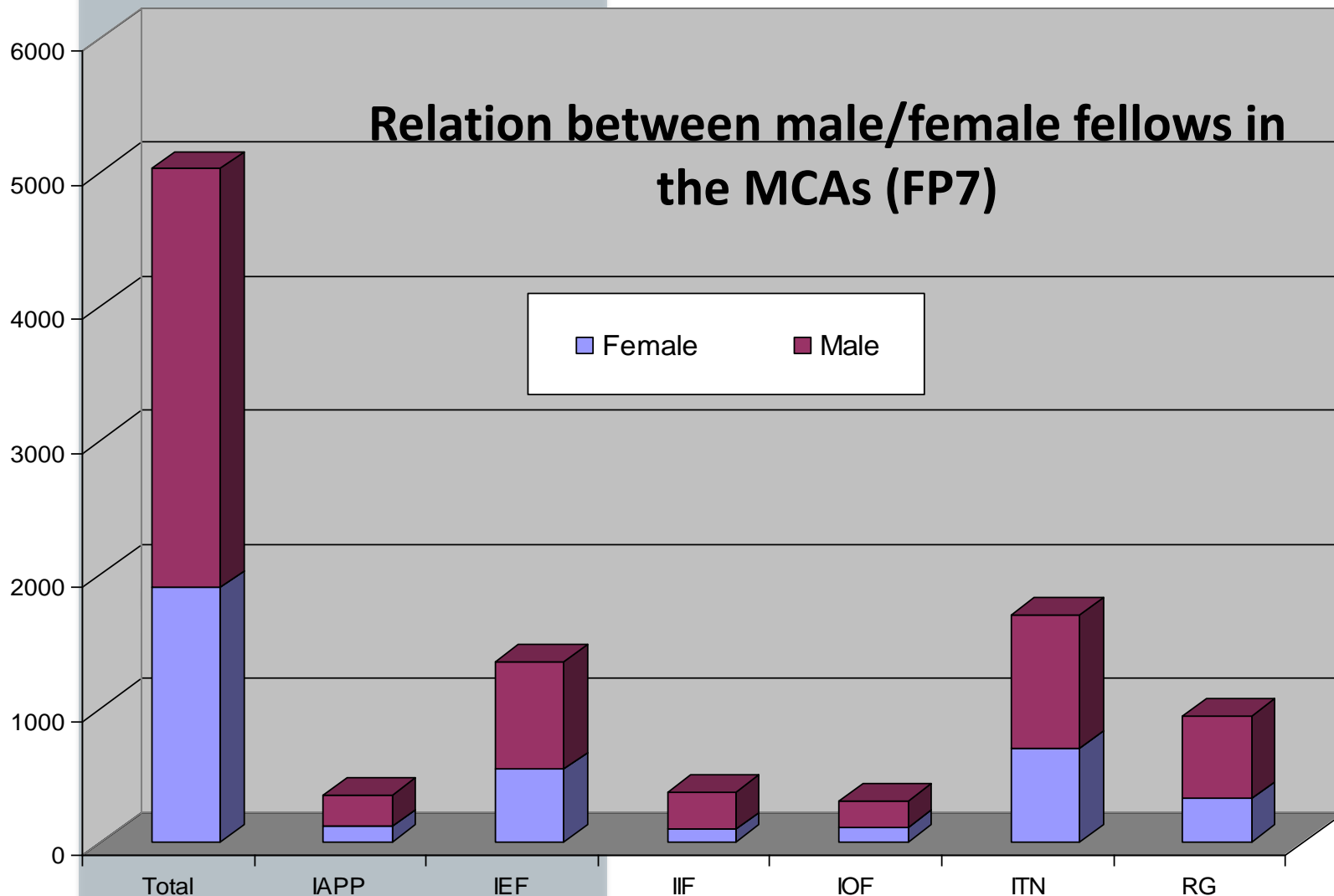

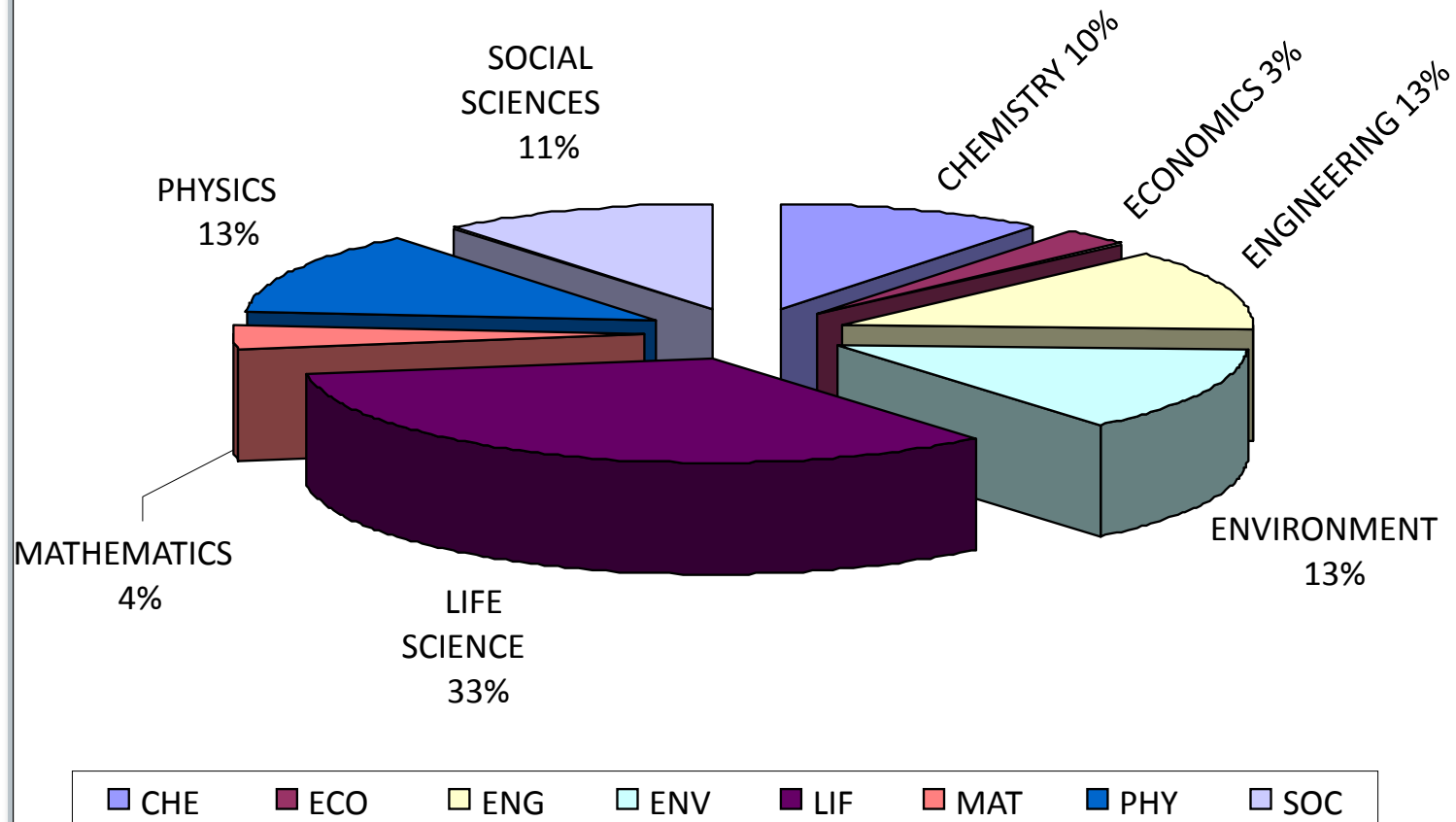


Marie Curie Actions 2007-2009

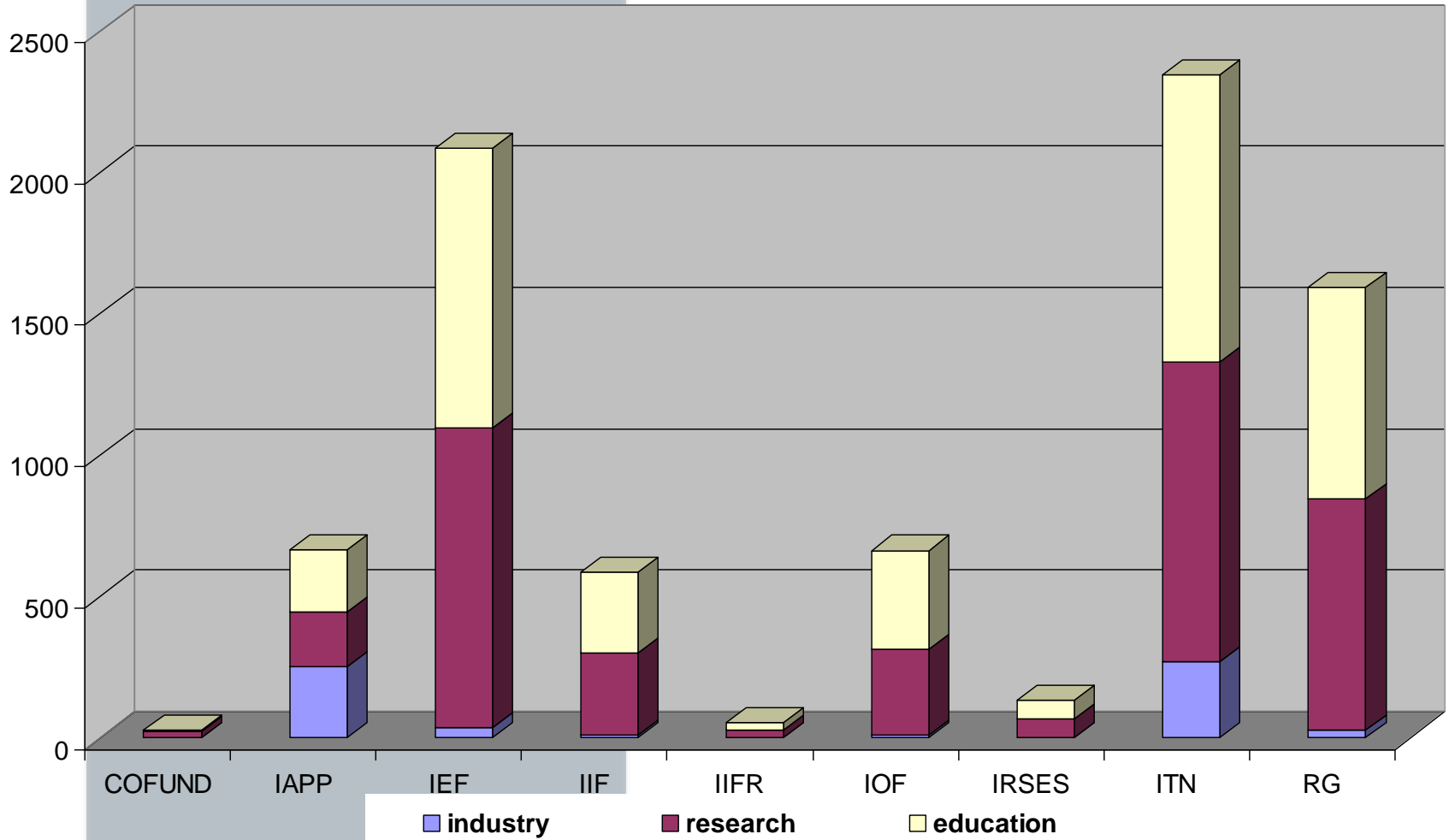

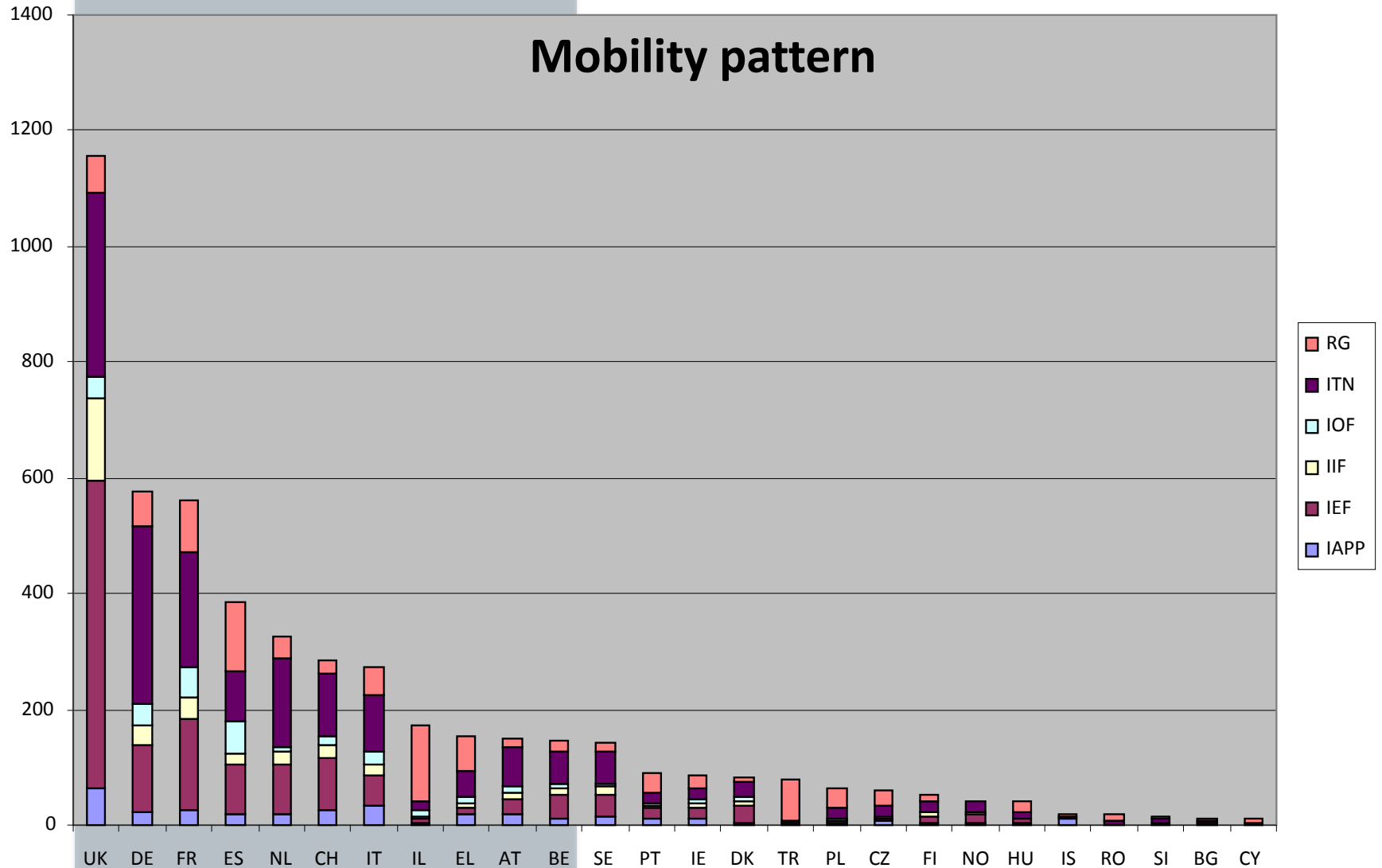
Distribution of FP7- Marie Curie Action projects in different panels



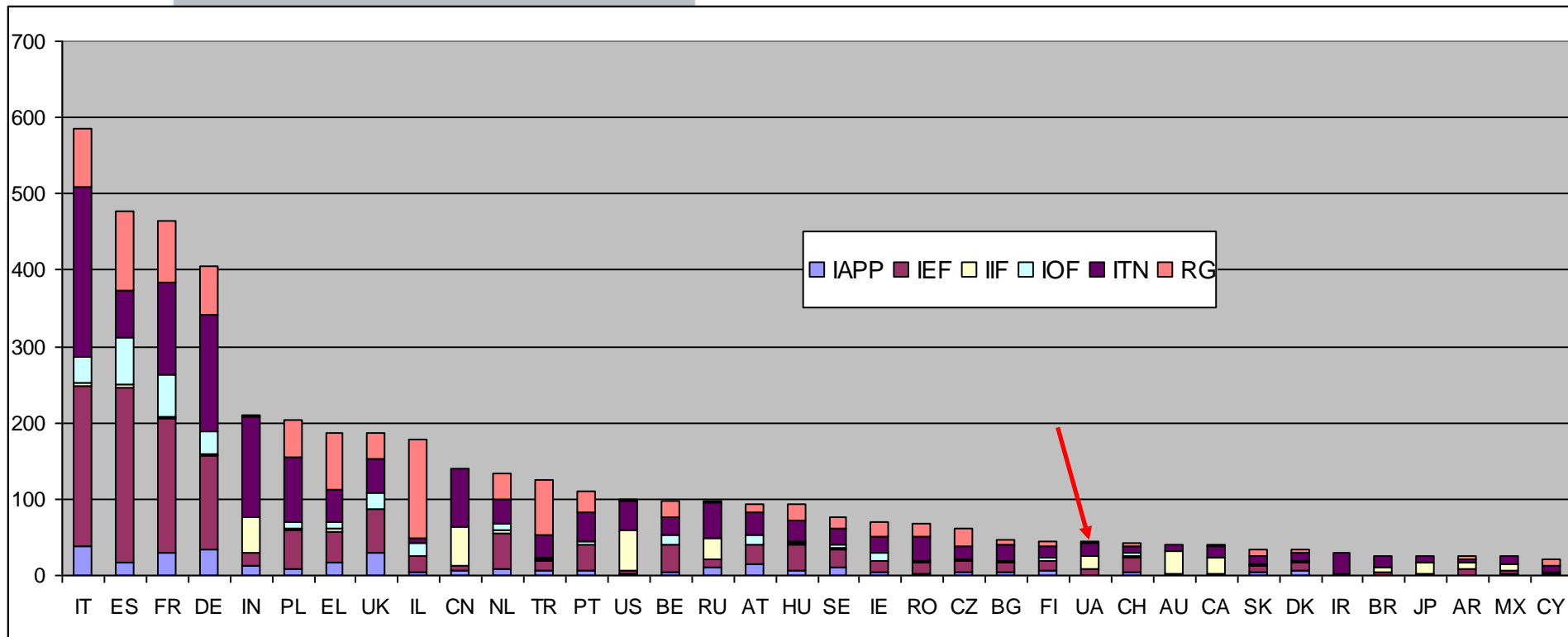
Marie Curie Actions Intersectoral pattern
